He explained the team building process to change the challenging current status of the society. He pointed the various ways to improve one's leadership qualities like vision, mission, making a strategy, executing the process for finishing a task in turn increasing the leadership qualities.



Mr. R.Rajendran, Member and Vice Chair, Student Activities Champion explained the profit of being a member of SAE, being a member not only provides knowledge in automotive sector but also encourages the students by providing scholarships.
